42.25 οἰκονομία, ας f: a task involving management and organization - 'task, commission, responsibility.' εἰ δὲ ἄκων, οἰκονομίαν πεπίστευμαι 'but if not of my own will, I have been entrusted with a responsibility' or 'but since I have not chosen it, I do it as a task entrusted to me' or 'I do it as a matter of duty, because God has entrusted me with this task' 1 Cor 9.17.

30.68 οἰκονομία, ας f. a plan which involves a set of arrangements (referring in the NT to God's plan for bringing salvation to mankind within the course of history) - 'purpose, scheme, plan, arrangement.' αἴτινες ἐκζητήσεις παρέχουσιν μᾶλλον ἢ οἰκονομίαν θεοῦ τὴν ἐν πίστει 'these promote controversies rather than God's plan, which is by faith' 1 Tm 1.4; φωτίσαι πάντας τίς ἡ οἰκονομία τοῦ μυστηρίου 'to make all people see what his secret plan is' Eph 3.9.

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[LS] οἰκονομία, ἡ, the management of a household or family, husbandry, thrift, Plat., etc.; and οἰκονομικός

[Thayer] οἰκονομία, οἰκονομίας, ἡ (οἰκονομέω), from Xenophon, and Plato down, "the management of a household or of household affairs; specifically, the management, oversight, administration, of others' property; the office of a manager or overseer, stewardship": Luke 16:2-4; hence, the word is transferred by Paul in a theocratic sense to the office (duty) intrusted to him by God (the lord and master) of proclaiming to men the blessings of the gospel, 1 Cor. 9:17; ἡ, οἰκονομία τοῦ Θεοῦ, the office of administrator (stewardship) intrusted by God, Col. 1:25. universally, administration, dispensation, which in a theocratic sense is ascribed to God himself as providing for man's salvation: αἴτινες ... ἡ οἰκονομίαν Θεοῦ τήν ἐν πίστει, which furnish matter for disputes rather than the (knowledge of the) dispensation of the things by which God has provided for and prepared salvation, which salvation must be embraced by faith, 1 Tim. 1:4 L T Tr WH; ἡν προέθετο ... καιρῶν, which good will he purposed to show with a view to (that) dispensation (of his) by which the times (namely, of infancy and immaturity cf. Gal. 4:1-4) were to be fulfilled, Eph. 1:9f; ἡ οἰκονομία τῆς χάριτος τοῦ Θεοῦ τῆς δοθείσης μοι, that dispensation (or arrangement) by which the grace of God was granted me, Eph. 3:2; ἡ οἰκονομία τοῦ μυστηρίου, the dispensation by which he carried out his secret purpose, Eph. 3:9 G L T Tr WH.*
